



Dental Prophylaxis Estimate CANINE

Periodontal disease is the #1 disease diagnosed in our pets. 80% of our dogs over the age of 3 have the disease and it is more common than cancer or heart disease. Unlike some of these devastating diseases, periodontal disease is easier for you, the pet owner, to prevent. It can add years to your pets' life. The bacterium associated with this disease gets into your pet's blood stream with has been linked to causing or worsening some metabolic conditions such as kidney and heart disease.

The first step toward prevention is a routine dental prophylaxis (cleaning) where we can evaluate the teeth and gums under anesthesia. We completely de-scale the tartar with an ultrasonic cleaner as well as use hand instruments, similar to what your human dentist uses. The teeth are then polished to smooth out any microscopic grooves and prevent any area of refuge for bacteria to grow.

This estimate includes the cost of the procedure, hospitalization, anesthetic monitoring, and medical charting.

Some additional costs may include, but are not limited to, teeth extractions, pain medications and stronger antibiotics.

We recommend IV fluids during the procedure to help keep blood pressure up and provide immediate IV access, if necessary, in the event of an emergency. Pre-anesthetic bloodwork is also recommended to ensure there are no underlying conditions and that the internal organs can properly process the anesthesia.
